





















# 1st Grade Choice Board

## Pick a Math Activity!

- Pick two playing cards and use cereal pieces or macaroni to make a model of an addition or subtraction fact.
- Play *Fact War* by splitting the cards into two piles. Each player flips two cards over, and the player with the greater sum/difference keeps both cards.
- Pick two cards and draw a picture to show an addition or subtraction fact.
- Write a word problem to go with a fact. For  $3 + 2$ , you might write "There were 3 brown dogs and 2 white dogs. How many dogs were there?" Then solve your word problem.
- Spread out all the cards on the table. Say a sum/difference and have your child use the cards to make the fact that goes with it. For example, you say "5" and your child might choose  $3 + 2$  or they may choose  $9 - 4$ .
- Play *What's Missing*. Read a fact to your child with one number missing. Have your child tell you what number is missing. For example,  $? + 5 = 10$ . What number is missing?

For something different, you could use dice instead of playing cards!

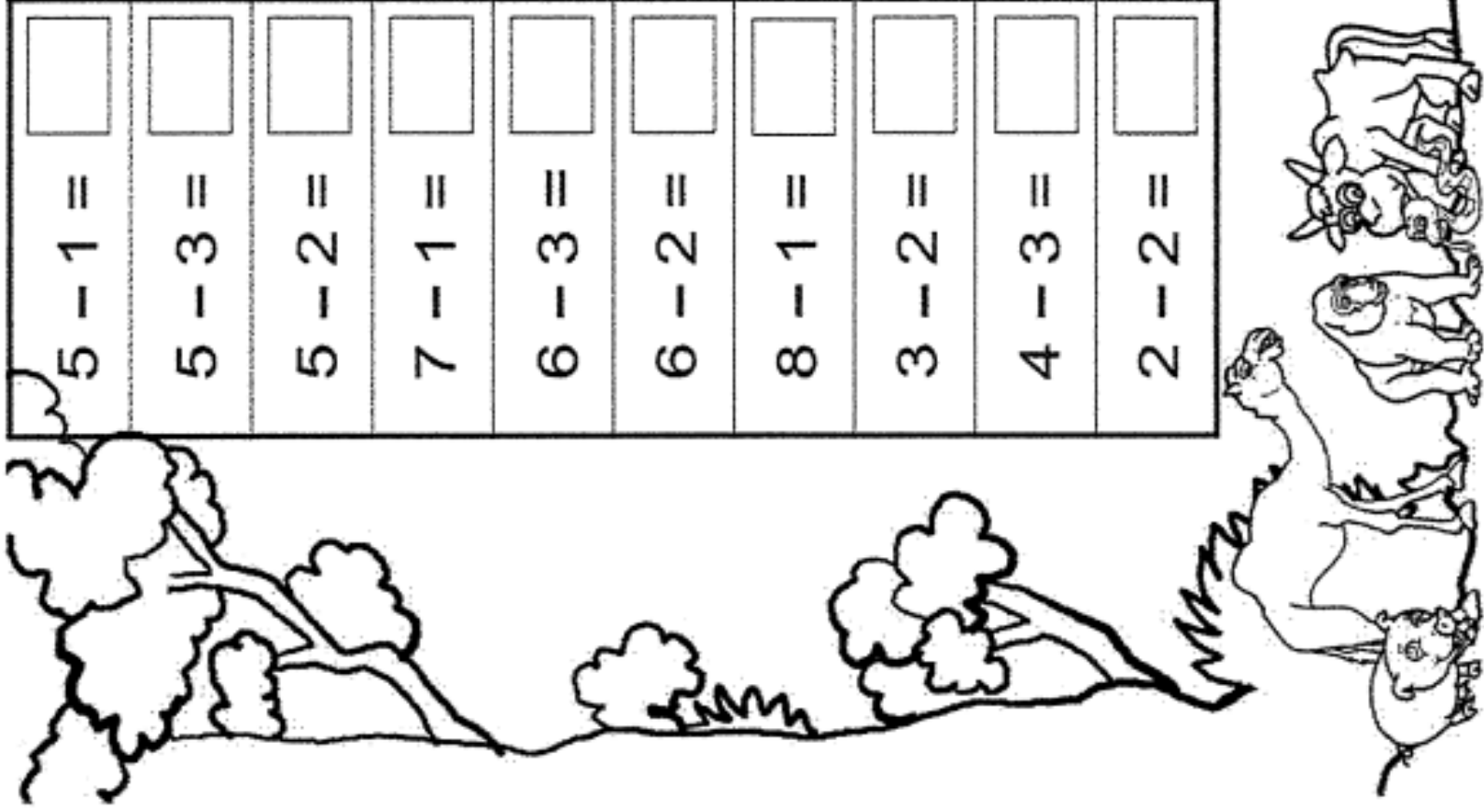
